Today in fine shape and form, *Alabama* is widely regarded as the ultimate example of yankee craftsmanship and traditional wooden shipbuilding. Originally used as a moored bar pilot vessel, *Alabama* is now fast and seaworthy. Completely refitted for the passenger trade, and equipped with twin diesels, *Alabama* now schedules day and overnight cruises and also makes an ideal day-sailer as well. She is skippered by Capt. Morgan H.

Douglas, third son of Captain Robert Douglas, who also helped in the reconstruction effort. The boat carries up to 49 passengers on day sails and 27 passengers overnight in her two spacious cabins. There is a crew of 6.

Dear Sea Scout Skippers

I would like to introduce the tall ship MYSTIC to you and your Sea Scout Ship. MYSTIC is a 170-foot, three-masted barquentine based out of Mystic, Connecticut. Designed and built for the passenger and sailing school trade and launched in 2007, she is the largest sailing ship built in the United States since World War II. We offer sail training aboard MYSTIC to people of all ages and nationalities. The focus of our sail training programs is to promote character building through development of self-confidence and teamwork, as well as to prepare those trainees who are interested for a career in the maritime sector. I have an immense amount of respect for the Sea Scouts program as my father, grandfather (which one?) and uncle all had Sea Scout Ships. I believe that MYSTIC is a very exciting and dynamic ship which will lend itself to the values and goals of your Sea Scouts program, whether you bring your ship as a group or introduce your scouts to our program individually.

Mystic Maritime School and Voyager Cruises work hand-in-hand to provide three different types of opportunities for youth to join the crew of MYSTIC:

1. Mystic Maritime School's Trainee Program:

Up to 32 Trainees are accepted onboard for one or more legs of a sail training voyage.. In 2009, our voyages begin July 1st and join the 2009 Atlantic Tall Ship Challenge for the summer. MYSTIC will cruise with other tall ships from around the globe to Plymouth MA, Boston MA, Halifax Nova Scotia, race across the Atlantic to Belfast Ireland, and then cruise to The Netherlands for DelfSail 2009. All of these destinations will hold world-class Tall Ship Events and Parades as the tall ships arrive. When the tall ship events finish, MYSTIC continues on her sail training voyages to Lisbon, Madeira, The Canary Islands, and the return trans-Atlantic voyage with the trade winds to The Virgin Islands. ## QUARTERDECK LEADERSHIP Training Course

**Saturday February , 2009**

Be prepared for each segment to be interactive, time of reflection, discussion and fun of getting to meet new friends, who are like you. This is not your ordinary classroom course. This time will be hands on learning about Leadership.

"*Camp Able*" is summer training week. You will be exposed to every requirement and have had a chance to do some hands on learning, hence the name of the camp. You will be taught all of the **nautical skills requirements** for the Sea Scout ABLE Rank.

Since SEAL is set aside for those that have completed their "*Ordinary*" requirements, the "*Camp Able*" learning program will help motivate you and give you the opportunity to learn the much more advanced "Able" nautical skills. This allows the rank of Quartermaster to be your next step.

Another beauty of "*Camp Able*" is it also provides a venue for if you are a top "*Able*" Sea Scout to get all your six "Quartermaster" teaching requirements completed. You can be one of those Camp Able youth instructors. This is where want-to-be Quartermasters can shine... in the running the camp. There is room for you to learn as you teach.

Typically to qualify for Camp Able , you must have the rank of Ordinary. However this year's camp is opened to all youth in our Ship. Ship 584 can bring no more than 15 youth and 4 adults. The adults will be safety observers.

**Cost:** \$350 youth and \$100 for adult...  
\$100 deposit by March 10 and all fees due by June 1.
